

THE OLD SIDE DOOR

AROUND THAT COUPLE WITH THE LADY IN THE LEAD,
The lead couple makes a 1/4 turn to the right and begins a counter-clockwise movement around behind the side couple. This call ends with the lead couple directly behind the side couple.

GENT FALL THROUGH AND TAKE THE LEAD,
The lady continues to move on around and behind the side gent, but while she is doing this, her pardner dances between the even couple thereby moving in front of his pardner and starting the counter-clockwise movement again.

**AROUND THAT COUPLE JUST ONCE MORE,
THE LADY FALL THROUGH THE OLD SIDE DOOR.**
The entire movement is repeated with the gent in the lead.

SIDE COUPLE SWING AND CIRCLE UP FOUR.
The side couple swings and then joins in a circle with the active couple.

**SWING THAT CORNER AND DON'T BE LATE,
SWING YOUR OWN AT THE GARDEN GATE.**

Note: This figure is often called "Around that Couple with the Lady in the Lead".

MOUNTAINEER LOOP

**JOIN YOUR HANDS AND CIRCLE SOUTH,
GET A LITTLE SUNSHINE IN YOUR MOUTH.
ACTIVE COUPLE DO THE MOUNTAINEER LOOP.**
The lead couple moves under the arch made by the side couple. The lead couple now separates, and moves around behind their opposite pardners and dances backward to starting place still holding to their corners' hand. This movement, which gives the figure its name, necessitates that side couple turn under their own arch.

**CIRCLE LEFT.
SIDE COUPLE MOUNTAINEER LOOP.**
Repeat the above movements with the side couple leading.
**CIRCLE LEFT, AND AROUND YOU GO,
SWING THAT CORNER GIRL IN THE CALICO.
SWING PARDNER AND MOVE ON SOUTH.**

Note: South refers to the left in mountain dancing. This dance figure is sometimes called "Cowboy Loop".
